## Wilson's Criteria for health screening

- \* The condition should be an important health problem
- \* The natural history of the condition should be understood
- \* There should be a recognisable latent or early symptomatic stage
- \* There should be a test that is easy to perform and interpret, acceptable, accurate, reliable, sensitive and specific
- \* There should be an accepted treatment recognised for the disease
- \* Treatment should be more effective if started early
- \* There should be a policy on who should be treated
- \* Diagnosis and treatment should be cost-effective
- \* Case-finding should be a continuous process.

## Hewitt's Criteria for health screening

- \* It should have been thought up spontaneously and without any research.
- \* It should sound good on the lunchtime news.
- \* Cost and practical implications should not be thought through and it need not have any relevance to real life.
- \* It should target middle class, female voters (sorry, patients).
- \* The BMA should offer a meaningless, neutral, response in order not to upset any gongs.
- \* It should help the Secretary of State for Health get into a new and better post as soon as possible.
